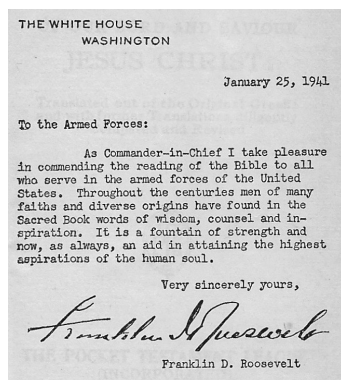
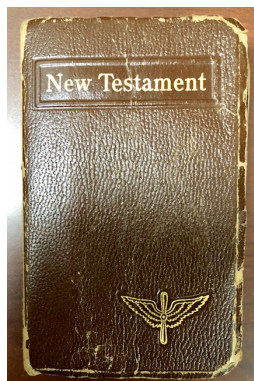


Spiritual Resolutions: Bible Study

The Good Book

Who would have taught the Bible to Timothy?

Paul encouraged Timothy: “Continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it, and how from infancy you have known the holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus” (2 Timothy 3:14-15).

By the Book

“The Bible is the only infallible rule of faith and practice.” (“Westminster Confession of Faith” Chapter 1)

“Give the Bible a chance to speak for itself and to make its own impressions. Read it seeking for illumination. The Bible is a whole and we can’t tamper with it.” (“What the Bible Is All About,” Henrietta C. Mears)

“Do not add to what I command you and do not subtract from it, but keep the commands of the Lord your God” (Dt 4:2).

In the Bible, God perfectly balances **ouch** and **mercy**.

“All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for:

- 1) **teaching** -
