#### FROM THE ASSISTANT PASTOR'S DESK

#### Time to Revitalize!

Over the past several years, our denomination, the Evangelical Presbyterian Church, along with some other denominations and churches, has been giving a great deal of attention to the declining number of Americans who attend church on a regular basis. The church in America is, in large measure, losing a majority of the younger generations. They show little interest in the church that we love so much. In a nutshell, the problem is that churches and church members do not like change. We like church to continue to be the way it has always been for us. Therein lies the problem. While the church is happy not changing, the world around us is never ceasing to change. Our culture is constantly on the move. Children study different subjects and in different ways than we did. Young people live their daily lives very differently than we who are older did. Social media was of little or no consequence to us. Today, it is where young people spend much of their lives, learn much of what they know, and even learn their values. To the culture of today, a church that is doing substantially what it did ten, fifteen or twenty years ago, that church is of little use or interest to them. We may want them to come to our church and be like us, but that is not going to happen, and if we are unwilling to change, we will become less and less relevant to the people living in our community who are younger than we are. I am not talking about changing the message. No, we must remain faithful to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Without that we have nothing to offer to those who are inside of the church, let alone those outside of it. But it is difficult to look at ourselves and see what we need to change in order to be relevant to outsiders who need Jesus just as much as we do. It is far easier for churches to stay in our comfort zones, do what we have always done, and die a slow death. And many churches are doing precisely that.

As big a danger as that is for the church in North America, there is an even bigger danger confronting us, and that is the unrecognized need for revitalization in each one of us as believers. Just as it is easy for the church to fall into a rut, so it is easy

for each of us to fall into a rut. We know what we believe. We know how and where we worship. We know what kinds of ways we serve the Lord in the church and in the community. We've gotten rather good at it, rather used to it, and rather comfortable in it. That in itself is not a



bad thing. But while we are remaining comfortable in our faith, younger generations are dying for a Savior (literally) and don't even know it. They need to meet Christians who will not just try to convert them or get them to visit our church, but who will love them genuinely and patiently, showing them what Christianity really is by our love.

It is time for revitalization, not only for our churches, but for each of us as the bride of Christ. It is time for each of us to re-vitalize, to come to life afresh and anew, to see the need around us for the lost not to become more like us (as most of us would like them to be), but more like Christ, as God would have them to be. That is what God's Word says it means to be a Christian and a disciple of Jesus Christ. It's not just a label. It's a description of who we are to be. Many of us have gotten far too comfortable with the label. It's time for us to revitalize, and to expend our lives and energy in building the church of Jesus Christ, not just languish in its demise.

#### From the February 23, 2017 meeting:

- The elders approved the request of Blair and Todd Bringhurst to have their infant son, Andrew, baptized on Easter Sunday.
- Gratitude was expressed to Chiquita Paulson for the outstanding job 2) she's doing as the Interim Music Director.
- Trivia Night will be Saturday, March 11th. The goal is to raise \$2,000 to purchase an acre of land on which to build a church next to our adopted orphanage in Kitale, Kenya.
- 4) The Easter Egg Hunt will be Saturday, April 8th, at 1:00 p.m.
- 5) Stay tuned for a revamped Rejoice and Recharge on Wednesday nights.
- Unanimous approval was given to the revised HHPC Constitution presented by Rev. Brundle.
- \$22,055 is in The Reverend Dr. James Quillin Memorial Fund, established for the purpose of purchasing a new church sign. A Task Force is working on the design and installation.
- Debt Reduction Campaign receipts through February 23rd were \$153,384, which is 61% of the goal of \$250,000.
- Through February 23rd, General Operating Fund receipts were \$57,697 and expenses were \$66,280 for a deficit of \$8,583. The reserve checking account balance is \$51,905.
