

Pastor's Remarks



"The B - I - B - L - E - yes, that's the book for me! I stand alone on the Word of God - the B - I - B - L - E!" Did you sing that song as a kid like I did? The children in our PDO sang it "loud and proud" at their recent Pre-K graduation. When I gave each of them a Children's Bible, I was praying in my heart that what they had sung would ring true

throughout their lives.

Is the Bible the book for you? Is it the book for me? Do we "stand alone on the Word of God" when we need comfort and peace and help? Or do we turn to other books, to other sources for comfort, peace and help? Of course there are many solid Christian books, but our primary, foundational book has to be the Bible. The Apostle Paul said, "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting, and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work" (2 Timothy 3:16-17).

I remember hearing a preacher on the radio ask, "Do you have a relationship with your Bible?" It's a poignant question, isn't it?! Like me, you may have a number of Bibles you read; perhaps they're in different locations - rooms in your house, your car, your office, your backpack. Or maybe you use a Bible app. The point of the question is not that it's best to use one Bible, but that it's essential to spend time every day listening to God by reading your Bible. You may have heard me ask, "How do you spell love?" The answer is T - I - M - E. In order to better know and love the One who loves you eternally, make sure 'you have a relationship with your Bible."

Remember that I love you, and please continue to be faithful in worship and in giving.

Elders' Notes - 4.26.18

- Grace Amgalan, Ellie Kate Billings, Garrett Sussey, and Will Stackhouse joined the Church on April 1 by Profession of Faith in Jesus Christ.
- 2) Woodlands Presbyterian Church in Hot Springs Village, AR is in the process of leaving the PCUSA and **joining the EPC**. Mike and Linda Walker, who were members of HHPC, have worked tirelessly in this effort.
- 3) Are you **supporting our missionaries**? \$15 per month per HHPC member ensures the continued support of three missionary couples who serve in Kenya, Ghana, Mongolia, and France. \$2,400 was sent to them in the first quarter of 2018, but only \$1,424 was given specifically for them.
- 4) The rezoning request for the **new Church sign and electronic message board** is taking longer than expected, so please be patient. Have you seen the mock-up in the lobby?

- 5) On April 16th, Jerry Brundle was suspended for at least one year from the office of teaching elder by a Presbytery judicial commission. **Further information** will be provided at the conclusion of the worship services on April 29th.
- 6) The first phase of our media upgrade has been completed with the installation of **new lights** for the chancel. \$15,000 is now needed for the installation of **two projectors and screens**, which will be placed on each side of the Good Shepherd window.
- 7) **Debt Reduction Campaign** receipts through April 26th were \$170,657, which is 69% of the goal of \$250,000.
- 8) **General Fund** income through March 31st was \$104,371 and expenses were \$120,851 for a shortage of \$16,480. The **reserve checking account balance** is currently \$48,428.
