I met Vince Keith for the first time sixteen years ago when he was bringing his grandson, Barrett, to our Parents' Day Out. Barrett was in my son Josh's class, and they became good buddies. Vince often stopped by my office after he dropped off his grandson. He had lots of questions about the Bible and the Christian faith. Before long, he started

coming to Church. His son and daughter-in-law soon followed, bringing Barrett with them, of course. God worked through our pre-school and our friendship to bring Vince and his family to faith in Jesus Christ.

Vince and his family moved to Colorado Springs in 2004. I hated to see them move, but rejoiced when they joined First Presbyterian Church. Vince had been divorced for many years, but ended up getting married to a woman in his new Sunday school class. Over the years, we stayed in touch through email and phone calls. Every year he would mail me a generous check for the Church. He never forgot Highland Heights. Vince died last month, and Ann, his widow, mailed me his annual contribution to HHPC. "Blessed are those who die in the Lord, for their deeds will follow them" (Revelation 14:13).

Vince Keith was an outstanding Grandfather, who knew that you spell love t-i-m-e. After he came to faith in Christ, he treasured Sunday morning worship. He never lost touch with the fact that he was a sinner saved by grace. And he never stopped giving to his home Church. Those are the things I remember about my friend Vince. **How do you think people will remember you?**

# **Cookies for GTMO!**



# **Elders' Notes - 9.27.18**

- 1) John Wright **joined the Church** by Reaffirmation of Faith on September 16th.
- 2) The Church's **fire alarm panel**, which you may have heard beeping lately, has been replaced at a cost of \$2,800.
- 3) About 1/3 of the congregation has paid their Per Member Asking of \$37 each. The **Per Member Asking Offering** is used to pay the expenses of our Presbytery and of the General Assembly such as trips by Evangelical Presbyterian Church officials advocating for the release of missionary Andrew Brunson.
- 4) **The Men's Bible Study** on Wednesday nights is going well. Rev. Bob James is the teacher, and they meet in Room 204.
- 5) Since the Shelby County Board of Adjustment approved the rezoning request for the **new Church sign and**

- **electronic message board** on August 22nd, bids are being sought.
- 6) Did you know you can give to the Church electronically? There are several ways through your bank, automatic withdrawals or the church website. It's an easy option to ensure regular giving. Questions? Contact Elder Kendra Bowers.
- 7) **Debt Reduction Campaign** receipts through September 27th were \$173,082, which is 69% of the goal of \$250,000.
- 8) **General Fund** income through August 31st was \$277,968 and expenses were \$304,143 for a shortage of \$26,175. The **reserve checking account balance** is currently \$31,054.
