Someone asked me the other day, "What is your **vision for the church?**" I answered the question the way I had heard James Quillin, who I served with as co-pastor for eight years, answer it: to increase the number of people who worship God. I think that's a Biblical vision for the church vs. a business-model vision or a particular pastor's vision for

the church. It was Jesus who cast the vision for the church when He told His disciples to "**go and make disciples of all nations**, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19).

So what does it look like to be a part of <u>increasing the</u> <u>number of people who worship God?</u>

It looks like what we are doing at HHPC more and more - inviting our family and friends to come to church. Most of the new members we've received lately are part of our church family because a member of HHPC invited them. Who might you invite to church?

It also looks like the investments we're making in new technology like electronic message boards, screens and projectors. Our desire is not to be trendy but to make use of technology to get peoples' attention. We're just \$6K short on the screens and projectors project. Have you given an extra offering to help make up the difference?

It also looks like our growing support of missionaries around the world. What a joy it is to pastor a church that takes Jesus at His word! *Are you participating in the missionary offering on the last Sunday of each month?*

Remember that I love you, and please continue to be faithful in worship and in giving.

FALL REGISTRATION for 2019-2020 has begun.


A table is set up outside the PDO office where you can get registration forms and have questions answered. Call Chrissy at 385-9000 for any questions.

Elders' Notes - 12.27.18

- 1) Glenn Stratton **professed his faith in Jesus Christ** and was **baptized** on December 27, 2018.
- 2) Gratitude was expressed to **Lesa Hart** and her team for directing an outstanding children's Christmas play.
- 3) Ruling Elders Lesa Hart and Jason Gatlin were elected to serve as **commissioners** to the Presbytery meetings and General Assembly meeting in 2019.
- 4) As of December 27th, the **Christmas Offering** total is \$6,377, which has been designated for the completion of the projector and screens project.
- 5) The installation of the **new Church sign** and electronic message board has begun.

- 6) Gratitude was expressed to HHPC for feeding the 60 children in our adopted orphanage in Kenya three meals a day that is 65,700 meals this year!
- 7) Did you know you can give to the Church electronically? There are several ways through your bank, automatic withdrawals or the church website. It's an easy option to ensure regular giving. Questions? Contact Elder Kendra Bowers.
- 8) **Debt Reduction Campaign** receipts through December 27th were \$176,032, which is 70% of the goal of \$250,000.
- 9) **General Fund** income through November 30th was \$385,478 and expenses were \$410,558 for a shortage of \$25,080. The **reserve checking account balance** is currently \$38,105.
