#### Pastor's Remarks



At my last Pastor's Lunch, I asked, "What brought you to Highland Heights?" The answers varied. Some said a friend invited them. Others said they live in neighborhoods near the church. There was a common denominator in all of their answers: "We were looking for a traditional Presbyterian Church."

Now that doesn't mean we are stuck in the past. We use guitars and other instruments in worship. We sing the best of the old and the best of the new. We are making good use of our projector and screen.

Many of our regular attenders who are not yet members are discovering that **HHPC's DNA** is a wonderful combination of classic worship and caring fellowship. May that combo continue to be the essence of who we are as a church.

## TOPS OUTING "Friday 13," March 2020

Boyette's Restaurant, 11:15 Reelfoot Lake State Park, Bald Eagles (Carpools)

The weather just did NOT cooperate for us to go spy on the eagles in February! Many TOPS participants were disappointed so we are launching "Reelfoot, Take 2." Weather permitting, we'll trek to Boyette's Restaurant and Reelfoot Lake (on Hwy 21, Tiptonville) on Friday, March13.

As originally planned, we will carpool. If you plan to go and are willing to drive, please let Linda Rush (Irrush@aol.com; 901-734-1100) know as soon as possible so she can coordinate carpool lists.

Those of us leaving from HHPC should depart no later than 9 am. Without stops, we will arrive around 11 and have time to "refresh" at Boyette's. We want to be seated between 11:15 and 11:30. Boyette's serves burgers, country ham, shrimp, frog legs, salads, steaks, chicken, etc., but the most popular item is their catfish meal!! For \$10.99 it includes 2 perfectly fried catfish filets, hush puppies, rolls, slaw, homemade onion rings, white or green beans, and French fries or twice-baked potato. Whoa!!



After lunch, we will cross the road to the Visitors Center/Museum to see the rehab eagles' cages, live snakes, pottery, and other artifacts - and pick up maps with Eagles Nests and vehicle pullovers marked.

Finally, each car will selftour around the perimeter of the lake, looking in the

trees and skies for our nation's proud symbols. While the eagles can be seen without them, it's a good idea to bring binoculars for an up-close view.

After a really good day, we will return home well before dark!

- 4) 72 children are enrolled in HHPC's **Parents' Day Out**. Fall registration is going on now, and classes are filling up. Contact Director Chrissy Thornton at 385-9000.
- 5) **Siding repairs** on the Sanctuary have been scheduled. **Foundation repairs** and **flooring replacement** in the connector between the Educational Building and the Sanctuary have also been scheduled.

- 6) **From Memphis to Kenya** \$30/month per HHPC family helps to feed the 90+children in our adopted orphanage in Kenya. *Are you giving to this important ministry?*

- 8) **Burn the Mortgage Campaign** receipts through February 27th were \$22,892, which is 8% of the goal of \$287,000.
- 9) **General Ministry Fund** income through January 31st was \$35,575 and expenses were \$42,671 for a difference of \$7,096. The **general ministry fund balance** on January 31st was \$39,877.
