#### Why we celebrate:

Congress debated and revised the wording of the Declaration, finally approving it on July 4. A day earlier, John Adams had written to his wife Abigail: The second day of July 1776, will be the most memorable epoch in the history of America. I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires, and illuminations, from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward forever more.

Adams's prediction was off by two days. From the outset, Americans celebrated independence on July 4, the date shown on the much-publicized Declaration of Independence, rather than on July 2, the date the resolution of independence was approved in a closed session of Congress.

#### Pastor's Remarks



My wife René and I always look forward to Bartlett's annual Fireworks Extravaganza on or near the 4th of July, but, like so many other events this year, it has been cancelled. While there won't be many large, public celebrations to attend this Independence Day, there are still many, many reasons to celebrate

the birthday of the United States of America. Many in the media would have us believe otherwise, but our country is a bastion of freedom. Justice and opportunity, law and order are the rule, not the exception in America. When the rules are broken, the overwhelming majority of Americans cry foul but don't throw out the baby with the bathwater. For 244 years, Americans have continued to expand the foundational principles of freedom first laid down in 1776. That is something to celebrate!

In a February 14th article in "The Patriot Post," Michael Swartz cited a speech President Ronald Reagan gave as he was leaving office in 1989. Three decades later, President Reagan's words are even more apropos: "Those of us who are over 35 or so years of age absorbed a love of country and an appreciation of its institutions. If you didn't get these things from your family, you got them from the neighborhood ... or from school ... and if all else failed, from the popular culture. But now, we're about to enter the nineties, and some things have changed. Younger parents aren't sure that an unambivalent appreciation of America is the right thing to teach modern children. And for those who create the popular culture, well-grounded patriotism is no longer the style. We've got to do a better job of getting across that America is freedom - freedom of speech, freedom of religion, freedom of enterprise. And freedom is special and rare."

#### The Battle is not Yours, but God's

When I had Stage 4 breast cancer, including stem cell transplant, my pastor preached a sermon from 2 Chronicles 20; his text was verses 14-18. Eager to know "the rest of the story," I went home read the whole chapter, and what I found became my focus during the ensuing months of treatment.

2 Chronicles says that the Spirit of God came upon Jahaziel in a great assembly of the people of Jerusalem and all Judah with this message:

"The Lord says to you: 'Do not fear or be dismayed because of this great multitude [of three armies coming to destroy them], for the battle is not yours but God's. You need not fight in this battle; station yourselves, stand and see the salvation of the Lord on your behalf.' Do not fear or be dismayed; tomorrow go out to face them, for the Lord is with you."

At this, Jehoshaphat and all Judah and the inhabitants of Jerusalem, fell prostrate and worshipped the Lord. When they got up, they praised God with a very loud voice.

Early the next morning they rose and Jehoshaphat told the people: "Listen to me, put your trust in the Lord your God, and you will be established. Put your trust in His prophets and succeed." He then appointed singers to go before the army marching to the battle site, to praise the Lord and sing: "Give thanks to the Lord, for His lovingkindness is everlasting." (What? Singing on the way to battle?)

"And when they began singing and praising," the Lord set ambushes against those from Ammon, Moab, and Mount Seir who had gathered to fight Judah. When Jehoshaphat's armies came to the appointed battleground what did they find? Not a single man of the three opposing armies was alive. The army of Judah only had to stand and see what God had done for them.

The people believed Jahaziel's message that God would take care of their battle, they fell on the ground and praised him for his promise, and they went out early in the morning singing, praising, and thanking God for who He is and for what He had promised to do. Did they have a clue as to how God was going to work this thing to their good? Of course not. Did they doubt he would do it? Absolutely not! And when the people started singing, that is when God worked His plan for those who loved Him.



We had raised our kids, I had had a blessed life, and I knew that I was either going to be healed or I was going to meet my Savior who had seen me through the ups and downs in life. Either way, God's plan would be the best plan.

Do we know how the many issues our country faces today will be resolved? Of course not. Can we prostrate ourselves to praise Him? To thank Him for still being in charge? Yes, we need to focus on Him because He is worthy, and because doing so is the answer to maintaining our mental, spiritual, and physical balance.
