

The congregation and friends of HHPC are invited to John Knox Foster's Ordination and Installation Service on Sunday, September 27th, at 3:00 p.m. at Christ Presbyterian Church in Daphne, AL.

then by their Presbytery. They must earn a Bachelors' degree and then a Master's degree (ie Seminary). They must pass the EPC written ordination exams and then oral examinations before the Ministerial Committee and the Presbytery. 
The battle is not


TOPS Moment God, Jehoshaphat, and "The Rest...of the Story"

Remember, in 2 Chronicles 20 God told Jehoshaphat, Judah, and Jerusalem that their battle

against two other armies was not theirs, they were to stand and see what He would do in their behalf. The next morning the men rose and mobilized to the appointed battle site, singing and praising and trusting God for the as-vet-unseen, promised miracle. That says a LOT about their faith.

When Judah arrived to the clearing in the wilderness, they witnessed that the Moabite and Ammonite armies





Wow! That's really great!! But Paul Harvey always ended his accounts with "Now you know [pause] the REST of the story."

REST of this story? On the fourth day after the battle, Jehoshaphat and his people assembled in the Valley of Beracah to bless the Lord, to praise and thank Him. After that, every man of Judah and Jerusalem returned home with Jehoshaphat at the head. Joyful that their enemies had been defeated, "they came to Jerusalem with harps, lyres and trumpets to the house of the Lord." And the kingdom of Jehoshaphat was at peace for his God gave him rest on all sides.

Jr. and Sr. High Youth and all adult classes will meet together in the Sanctuary for six Sundays; Pastor Tim will lead a church-wide study of "Generous Justice" by Presbyterian pastor and author Timothy Keller.

- 10) **General Ministry Fund** income through June 30 was \$237,540 and expenses were \$213,135 for a surplus of \$24,405. The **General Ministry Fund balance** on June 30 was \$71,379.
