

Pastor's Remarks



Can you guess what the top five New Year's resolutions are? #1 is exercise more. #2 is lose weight. #3 is eat healthier. #4 is get out of debt. #5 is spend more time with family. Chances are we will make at least one of these resolutions as we begin 2021.

I want to recommend that we make a spiritual resolution, a resolve to follow the Golden Rule: "Do to others as you would have them do to you" (Luke 6:31). Why do you think Jesus taught His followers to treat others the way they wanted to be treated? I think it's because of what He saw and heard. He must have been watching and listening to the way they interacted, and it hurt Him to see how often they both wounded and neglected each other.

In order to follow the Golden Rule, one of the things we ought *to stop doing* is having "fun" at the expense of others. When we are about to say something about someone in their presence but to other people that would embarrass them and would embarrass us if the shoe was on the other foot, Jesus wants us to keep our mouths shut. For example, since we don't want people to laugh at the way we look, we can rest assured other people feel the same way.

In order to follow the Golden Rule, one of the things we ought to start doing is building other people up. When we see someone has done something that was kind or helpful, Jesus wants us to open our mouths. For example, since we like it when someone appreciates what we have done, we can rest assured other people feel the same way.

Let's make a New Year's resolution to follow the Golden Rule.

Well, we are officially bringing 2020 to an end but it seems the same topics are going to follow us into 2021. Lockdowns, masks, social distancing, vaccines and the political divide. The youth will however attempt to stay resilient and continue with as close to "normal" schedules and events whenever possible. That said, I am looking forward to 2021, but I will be planning things on the fly based on capacities, shutdowns, mandates, and whatever else 21 wants to throw at us.

As for what is scheduled, for the high school youth, there will be a lock-in for New Years. We will have dinner, celebrate the new year, play games and watch movies. You don't need to bring anything but yourself.

I will have a field trip planned for all youth in middle to late January, but where will depend on how the lockdowns are going. I may plan a special night-in if we have capacity issues.

I will be looking into a group messaging type of service for the youth and parents. While I keep contact with the older youth pretty directly, I will look for options for my younger group and parents that will be easy to use. Look for info on that in the next few weeks.

Lastly, I would like to thank the congregation for supporting the youth. Without your help, what I do would not be possible. Your prayers and financial support go a long way in supporting the youth and me.

Sanctity of Human Life Sunday 2021

I will praise thee; for I am fearfully and wonderfully made: marvellous are thy works; and that my soul knoweth right well. Psalm 139:14 $\rm KJV$

On January 13, 1984, President Ronald Reagan issued a proclamation designating January 22 as the first National Sanctity of Human Life Day. (January 22, 1973, was the day the U.S. Supreme Court legalized abortion-on-demand in all 50 states.) Churches around the United States use the day to celebrate God's gift of life, commemorate the many lives lost to abortion, and commit themselves to protecting human life at every stage.

Churches continue to recognize the third Sunday in January as Sanctity of Human Life Sunday. In 2021, that date will be January 17.



We are participating in the Bottles for Life campaign of Life Choices. Many bottles have been picked up. The deadline to return the bottles is January 31st. Life Choices will pick them up the first week of February. The idea is for you to put your spare change in the bottle. However, cash and checks are fine, too. Please make checks out to Life Choices of Memphis. These funds do not need to go through our accounting system.

If you are not coming in-person to Church, you can still participate. Just drop a check in the mail, and we will turn it in with the rest of the bottles we collect. Our Church has been one of the highest donors in Memphis.

In 2020, the Elders offered space at HHPC - rent-free - to Life Choices for a satellite office/clinic. The Life Choices Board greatly appreciated the offer and is working with Ruling Elder Rob McCleary and Pastor Tim on the

details and the timing. Initially the plan is for Life Choices to use space at Highland Heights once a week during the day. On their end, they are working on staffing and equipment needs. On our end, depending on which services might be offered, we will need to do some renovations to the rooms Life Choices will use. Please ask the Lord to bless both parties as we move together to this next level of partnership.





Usually there is a Children's Christmas Program on a December Sunday evening. As with everything else this year, we had to punt but Santa still came to visit. During the Sunday School hour, there were stories, skits and lessons. It was a big hit. Thank you all.

Elders' Notes - 12.17.20

- 1) Lugenia Perry joined the Church by Reaffirmation of Faith on December 6. Welcome back to HHPC, Lu!
- **2) 60 pledges, totaling \$310,844**, have been turned in, which is 68% of the 2021 Budget of \$460,051 a great start. Have you turned in your pledge card?
- 3) The elders accepted a bid of \$31,000 to connect to city sewer service. If the Lightman family, who owns the property west of the Church, were not bearing the brunt of the expense, it would cost the Church over \$100,000.
- 4) At the **Annual Congregational Meeting** on November 29, Kendra Bowers, Lesa Hart and Perk Perkins were elected **Ruling Elders**; Karen Huddleston, Barbara Almond, Joe Dobson, and Barb James were elected **Deacons**.
- 5) This year there will be two **Christmas Eve Candlelight Communion Services** at 5:30 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.
- 6) **From Memphis to Kenya** \$30/month per HHPC family helps to feed the 90+ children in our adopted orphanage in Kenya. *Are you giving to this important ministry?*
- 7) **The Christmas Offering** this year has been earmarked by the Elders for the Burn the Mortgage Campaign.
- 8) **Burn the Mortgage Campaign** receipts through December 13 were \$76,922, which is 26.8% of the goal of \$287,000. The combination of BMC receipts and monthly mortgage payments has decreased the balance to \$204,604. *The next principal payment of \$26,510 includes Christmas Offering gifts and will reduce the balance to \$179,644.*
- 9) **General Ministry Fund** income through November 30 was \$430,408 and expenses were \$405,436 for a surplus of\$24,972. The **General Ministry Fund balance** on November 30 was \$71,945.
