Pastor's Remarks



On April 23rd, HHPC will host the Spring meeting of the Presbytery of the Central South, which means leaders (Ruling Elders and Teaching Elders) from the EPC congregations in our geographical area will meet together in the Sanctuary for worship, fellowship and business. Arguably the most

important business Presbyteries conduct is the examination of those: who want to study for the ministry, who are seeking to be ordained as ministers and those ministers who are transferring into the EPC from other denominations. Why is examination of ministers the most important business of Presbyteries? It is because ministers (Teaching Elders in Presbyterian lingo) are tasked with "correctly handing the Word of Truth" (2 Timothy 2:15).

In 1706 nine teaching elders and four ruling elders who were living in the British colony of Pennsylvania but had been born in England, Scotland and Ireland met in Philadelphia "to consult the most proper measure for advancing religion and propagating Christianity" in the American colonies. They formed the first presbytery in the new world.

315 years later, in our Presbytery, there are currently 31 churches and six new church plants. One of the new church plants is in the Highland Heights neighborhood our congregation was organized in 100 years ago and called home until 1996. It is called The Avenue, and it is thriving. The pastor, Tim Johnson, and I have talked about our two congregations partnering. During our centennial and now that coronavirus anxiety is decreasing, I hope we will get started.

Put the Presbytery meeting on your calendar for April 23rd. The worship service starts at 12:30, and volunteers are needed.

Remember that I love you, and please continue to be faithful in worship and in giving.

Elders' Notes - 3.25.21

- 1) Donald Miller was hired to **play guitar** when the lead guitarist Russell Mann is unavailable.
- 2) The purchase of some new **audio visual equipment** was approved.
- 3) **HHPC is hosting the Spring Presbytery meeting** on Friday, April 23, from 12:30-5:00 p.m. Volunteers will be needed.
- 4) **Gratitude** was expressed to: RE Lesa Hart, RE Charle Dunstan and John Blatt for replacing ceiling tiles and making repairs around the Church and to RE Rob McCleary for securing a Skid Steer and spreading a truckload of sand in the ruts on the recreational field.
- 5) Invite at least one person to come to Church with you on Easter Sunday.
- 6) From Memphis to Kenya \$30/month per HHPC family helps to feed the 90+ children in our adopted orphanage in Kenya. *Are you giving to this important ministry?*
- 7) **Burn the Mortgage Campaign** receipts through March 21 were \$104,338, which is 36.4% of the goal of \$287,000. The combination of BMC receipts and monthly mortgage payments has decreased the balance to \$147,328.
- 8) In order for the Church to be **100% Debt-Free by her 100th Birthday** on December 11, 2021, \$120,000 needs to be raised, which translates to approximately \$50/week or \$200/month per HHPC family. *In nine months, let's burn the mortgage!*
- 9) **General Ministry Fund** income through February 28 was \$66,254 and expenses were \$79,828 for a difference of \$13,574. The **General Ministry Fund balance** on February 28 was \$45,391.
