Pastor's Remarks



This year as we celebrate 100 years of worship and work, I have been highlighting some of the history of HHPC in my "Cornerstone" articles. This month I would like to write about our Church's history of sharing our facilities with other congregations.

When the Church was organized in 1921, the charter members met in peoples' homes. Then for several years, they met at **Highland Heights Baptist Church.** After they moved into their first building, a small white-frame Sanctuary at the corner of Summer and Holmes, the elders sent a letter of thanks to the Baptists for their hospitality.

It would seem that sharing space is in our DNA. After the congregation voted to relocate and construction began on the new property on Hwy 64, the property on Summer Avenue sold before the new digs were ready. Evergreen Presbyterian Church offered their basement to Highland Heights, and we met there for 18 months. In 1998-1999, Grey's Creek Church met at Highland Heights on Sunday afternoons while their church was being built on Houston Levee. In 2006-2007, a black Presbyterian congregation, Celebration of Life, met at Highland Heights on Sunday nights and joined our folks on Wednesday nights. More recently, Grace Bible Church, a Reformed Baptist congregation, met at HHPC on Sunday nights until they found a place to rent on Sunday mornings, and a congregation of Community of Faith International is worshipping now on Sunday mornings in one of our Sunday school rooms.

In our next 100 years, unless Jesus returns, I feel certain we will continue to practice what we preach when we stand and say, "I believe in the one holy and universal Church."

Remember that I love you, and please continue to be faithful in worship and in giving.

Elders' Notes from September 23, 2021

- 1) To learn more about HHPC and the EPC and what it would mean to be a member of Highland Heights, **please join Pastor Tim for lunch on Sunday, October 17th.**
- 2) **A congregation of Community of Faith International** is meeting in the Beacons' Sunday school room on Sunday mornings at 10:45 a.m.
- 3) The annual **Fall Youth Retreat** will be Friday-Sunday, October 8-10, at Nathan Bedford Forrest State Park in Camden, TN.
- 4) The Deacons will spearhead their annual **Stocktober** drive next month. This year they will be collecting food and clothing for Memphis Union Mission.
- 5) **From Memphis to Kenya** \$30/month per HHPC family helps to feed the 90+ children in our adopted orphanage in Kenya. Are you giving to this important ministry?
- 6) In order for the Church to be **100% Debt-Free by her 100th Birthday** on December 11, 2021, approximately \$50/week or \$200/month needs to be contributed by each HHPC family. In three months, let's burn the mortgage!
- 7) **Burn the Mortgage Campaign** receipts through September 19 were \$148,962 which is 51.9% of the goal of \$287,000. The combination of BMC receipts and monthly mortgage payments has decreased the balance to \$79,694.
- 8) **General Ministry Fund** income through August 31 was \$285,224 and expenses were \$311,406 for a difference of \$26,182. The **General Ministry Fund balance** on August 31 was \$32,782.
