## Pastor's Remarks



This year as we celebrate 100 years of worship and work, I have been highlighting some of the history of HHPC in my "Cornerstone" articles. This month I would like to write about the three denominations we have been a part of.

When the Church was organized

in 1921, the Presbytery in West Tennessee was a part of the **Presbyterian Church in the United States**. The PCUS was commonly referred to as the Southern Presbyterian Church. It had been organized in 1865 at the conclusion of the Civil War. The organizing of new congregations was a major emphasis of the PCUS.

In 1983, the PCUS and the Northern Presbyterian Church reunited to form the **Presbyterian Church in the United States of America**. As a result, Highland Heights became a part of the PCUSA. Conservatives in both the Southern and Northern branches had reservations about the merger, and HHPC was involved in the **New Wineskins Association of Churches**, a group that attempted to reform the PCUSA from within.

In 2008, after months of study and on the unanimous recommendation of the Session, the congregation voted unanimously to join the **Evangelical Presbyterian Church**, a denomination that insisted on both teaching and ruling elders adhering to the essentials of the Christian faith. Most of the Presbyterian Churches in West Tennessee have now joined us in the EPC. Organizing new churches is a major emphasis of the EPC, as it was for the old PCUS. In fact, one of the newest congregations in the EPC is The Avenue, which meets in the old Highland Heights neighborhood. Providential, huh?!

Remember that I love you, and please continue to be faithful in worship and in giving.



## Elders' Notes from October 28, 2021

- 1) **Barbara & Dennis Glaze and Eunice Rose** joined the Church by Reaffirmation of Faith on October 17.
- 2) **Amy & Bob Bunge**r joined the Church on October 17. Bob joined by Reaffirmation of Faith, and Amy joined by Profession of Faith; she will be baptized on November 21.
- 3) Work has begun on connecting the Church's three buildings to the city sewer line.
- 4) The **2022 Budget** was approved. It will be presented at the Annual Congregational Meeting on November 14.
- 5) The elders are hoping to have a part-time **Young Adults/Couples Ministry Director** on the Church staff in 2022.
- 6) The Annual **Thanksgiving Lunch** will be Sunday, November 21, at 12:15 p.m.
- 7) **From Memphis to Kenya** \$30/month per HHPC family helps to feed the 90+ children in our adopted orphanage in Kenya. Are you giving to this important ministry?
- 8) In order for the Church to be **100% Debt-Free by her 100th Birthday** on December 11, 2021, approximately \$50/week or \$200/month needs to be contributed by each HHPC family. *In three months, let's burn the mortgage!*
- 9) **Burn the Mortgage Campaign** receipts through October 28 were \$164,055 which is 57.2% of the goal of \$287,000. The combination of BMC receipts and monthly mortgage payments has decreased the balance to \$55,573.
- 10) **General Ministry Fund** income through September 30 was \$339,128 and expenses were \$348,231 for a difference of \$9,103. **The General Ministry Fund balance** on September 30 was \$49,862.
