## Pastor's Remarks



One of my favorite passages of Scripture is John 10:27-30, because all Christians need to be reminded that **we belong to Jesus body and soul**. In these verses, Jesus said, "My sheep listen to My voice; I know them, and they follow Me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one can *snatch* them

out of My hand. My Father, who has given them to Me, is greater than all; no one can *snatch* them out of My Father's hand." *I particularly like Jesus's use of the verb "snatch."* Once Jesus saves us, no one can take us away from Him.

Presbyterian pastor and seminary professor Ben Lacy Rose taught that we hold either to the cat or the monkey doctrine of salvation. A mother cat, wishing to move her kittens, grasps them firmly by the nape of the neck in her mouth and carries them to where she wants them. In stark contrast, baby monkeys must grab hold of their mother's fur and hold on for dear life as she swings through the trees. If little monkeys don't hold on tight, they fall to their death.

Those who subscribe to the monkey doctrine of salvation believe they have hold of God and it is up to them to hold on tight. Those who subscribe to the cat doctrine of salvation believe God has hold of them and will never let go. One of the many places the Bible clearly teaches the "cat doctrine" is John 10:27-30. "Jesus said, 'No one can *snatch* My sheep out of My hand.'"

I hope and pray you believe in the cat doctrine of salvation. When we love Jesus, no one, including ourselves, can snatch us out of His nail-pierced hands. He will never let go of us.

Remember that I love you, and please continue to be faithful in worship and in giving.

crackers, saltines

Fruits: Fruit cups, applesauce, dried fruit

Canned Goods: chili, stew, spaghetti & meatballs,

ravioli, soups, beans, peas, corn

When possible, pull top cans are helpful.

granola bars and bottled water



# Elders' Notes from August 25, 2022

- 1) On August 21, Allison Schwab, daughter of Valerie Schwab, was baptized.
- 2) Gratitude was expressed to all who helped the Church reach our goal of raising \$10,000 to build a boys' dormitory at our adopted orphanage in Kenya. \$10,380 was given, which was matched, and construction has begun!
- 3) Gratitude was expressed to Dennis & Barbara Glaze and Lavon Hayes for their hard work on stabilizing the gazebo on the playground.
- 4) The elders approved the collection of **an offering for the rebuilding of College Hill Presbyterian Church**, the oldest church in North Mississippi, on August 21 and 28. A fire destroyed much of the historic Sanctuary on August 14. \$825 has been given so far. In addition, the elders pledged \$1,000 from HHPC's General Ministry Fund. Please give generously.
- 5) There are openings for one or two children in many of the rooms in HHPC's **Parents' Day Out**. Classes are on M/W and T/Th for children 12 months Pre-K. Tuition is \$220/month for one child and \$170/month for each additional child. There is a need for one new PDO teacher. Contact Director Chrissy Thornton @ 351-3534.
- 6) From Memphis to Kenya \$30/month per HHPC family helps to feed the 100+ children in our adopted orphanage in Kenya. Are you giving to this important ministry?
- 7) **General Ministry Fund** income through July 31 was \$251,613 and expenses were \$251,034 for a surplus of \$579. **The General Ministry Fund balance** on July 31 was \$78,070.
