## The Four Chaplains

On February 3, 1943, the U.S. Army transport ship Dorchester was one of three vessels in a convoy moving across the Ocean from Newfoundland, Canada to an American in Greenland. 902 Servicemen, Merchant Marines and civilians were onboard.
The ship was only 150 miles from her destination when, shortly after, a Nazi launched a torpedo. The initial blast scores of men and seriously many more.
