TOPS, SR. ADULT OUTING ROCK AND SOUL MUSEUM 191 Beale St. (FREE TO SHELBY CO. RESIDENTS on TUESDAYS) August 15, 2023 - 10 a.m.

The **ROCK AND SOUL MUSEUM** provides a digital audio guided tour of the history of the Memphis music and recording industry from sharecroppers in the 30s, through the explosion of Stax, Sun, Hi Records to the heyday of the 70s. This includes both black and white voices of the past telling their stories. Whereas race was generally a divisive issue in The South, music transcended barriers that even churches couldn't overcome. Both races recorded at the same studios.

You'll be amazed by more than 100 songs by rock singers and soul stars who got their start here, 3 audio visual programs, over 30 instruments and 40 costumes. Listen to the background music or choose the songs you want to hear at display cases. Did you know that in 1955 Memphis launched the first "all-girl" radio station in the nation – "W-HER, 1000 Beautiful Watts," started by Sam Phillips, broadcast from a Holiday Inn? Yep!!

So, mark this on your calendar NOW...and join us for a fun, nostalgic day with TOPS and music that will have you swaying and swinging. You will be so glad you did!!

Tuesdays offer FREE admission to Shelby County residents with a valid I.D. upon arrival; other adults pay \$13, but there are discounts for members of AARP, AAA, Smithsonian, and military.

We advise riding the church van or carpooling and parking in the FedExForum parking lot as the museum is located on the FedExForum sports and entertainment complex. Park for 2 hrs for \$2.50 or \$10 for the day. Lunch venues are being explored at this time.

Gratitude was expressed to **Jason and Traci Gatlin and their team** for an outstanding event.
- 2) Our **new Music Director**, Terry Walker, will begin his ministry at Highland Heights on August 9.
- 3) **The Lord's Supper** will be observed on the second Sunday next month, which will be August 13.
- 4) **Jubilation Jazz will present a Veterans' Day concert at HHPC** on Wednesday, November 15, from 5:30-6:30, followed by supper from 6:30-7:30. *Invite a friend!*
- 5) You will be receiving an email or a letter in the mail from the Church asking you to participate in the **Per Member Asking** offering, which is \$36/member to support the ministries of our local EPC Presbytery and the national EPC General Assembly.
- 6) Gratitude was expressed to **Dennis and Barbara Glaze** for repairing the wall in the kitchen pantry.
- 7) A thank-you note was received from Life Choices for \$1,138.80 that was raised through Bottles for Life last Christmas.
- 8) **From Memphis to Kenya** \$30/month per HHPC family helps to feed the 80+ children in our adopted orphanage in Kenya. *Are you giving to this important ministry?*
