
Every meal includes hot dogs for the kids. Also, no matter what the dessert is, there is always vanilla ice cream on the table.

Pastor's Remarks



Veterans' Day is this month, so I would like to focus on a couple of items related to our military Veterans.

First of all, I hope you are planning to attend the **Jubilation Jazz concert** on Wednesday night, November 15th, at 6:30 in the Sanctuary. It

will be a unique blend of Patriotic, Christian, Big Band, and Jazz music. I first heard them when I went with TOPS to a concert at 2nd Presbyterian Church. You don't want to miss it! And please bring neighbors and friends with you.

Second, I want to share with you a recent victory for religious freedom. First Liberty, a religious rights' legal organization endorsed by the EPC, represented the Northeast POW/MIA Network, a private organization of veterans and patriots in the New England area. They had been sued by the deceptively-named Military Religious Freedom Foundation for placing a Bible on a POW/MIA Remembrance Table at the VA Medical Center in Manchester, New Hampshire. The MRFF even went so far as to call the Bible on display "repugnant." The lawsuit was dismissed, which means the Bible stayed. You have probably seen similar tables and displays in local restaurants.

As American Christians, we must be vigilant. Anti-Christian groups like the MRFF are hard at work. These groups would have us believe freedom **of** religion should be freedom **from** religion, and specifically from the Christian religion. Jesus said, "Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 5:10).

Remember that I love you, and please continue to be faithful in worship and in giving.

TREAT YOURSELF: TRAVEL WITH TOPS to OPRYLAND HOTEL

Between the hustle of Thanksgiving and the bustle of Christmas, enjoy a day at the beautiful Opryland Hotel. And leave the driving to us...well, actually to a professional company. Last year, we took my mom with her walker, and we had a great time, taking in all the stunning Holiday décor, both man-made displays and trees as well as the tons of beautiful natural plants and flowers.

Tuesday, November 28, 8 am, the bus will leave Highland Heights to take us on a day trip to Nashville. The plan is to return to HHPC by 8 pm. The bus fee will be between \$50-70 each, depending on the number of participants. We need 30-40 for this price, and if we have fewer we will cancel.

The advantage of a bus is significant. To take a personal vehicle, there is gas expense, \$35 parking, a hike from a parking place to building (regardless of weather) and back, a congested departure from hotel to interstate, and a night drive back to Memphis after a big day.



participants will need to plan to eat out (at Hotel or Opry Mills food court), and money to take

part in any special events. Some want to see the amazing ice sculptures in a 9°F setting (parkas provided) and will need to buy advance tickets online.

If you've never been, you can't imagine the cascades, many huge poinsettia trees, countless commercial trees decorated – many by country music singers, the boat ride through the hotel atrium (extra), timed water spouts to music, and plenty of places to take selfies. The glass-domed atrium allows natural light to make the venue uplifting. There are places to grab a bite to eat or an ice cream treat as well as \$shops\$.

The Opryland Hotel does not charge an admission fee or require you to spend the night; it also has ramps and elevators to go from level to level.

Your RSVP and non-refundable bus money (watch for details) are due Nov 15. This special day is planned with our HHPC senior adults in mind, but if we have seats available, we welcome friends and relatives. Please contact Linda at lrrush@aol.com; 901-386-4762 to register your interest.
