Not only does God know us and by name, but He has also told us to call Him by He is not an deity. He is the LORD!

"God's Name"

"It is hard for us in the modern world to understand or to appreciate the Hebrew's sense of about a name, and particularly about the name of, which stood for His power." ("The Lord's Prayers," Elton Trueblood, p. 50)
From the burning bush, God shouted at Moses, "Don't come any!" and then He told Moses that His name was "I who I" (Exodus 3:14). The English translation for this Hebrew word/phrase is "the" It means "I have been," whereas everything and everyone else had a beginning.
