The to the Lord's Prayer is a footnote in most Bibles, because it's not found in of the ancient Greek manuscripts (copies of the Bible).
Many of the first Christians included the concluding phrase, because Jews in Jesus' day ended their prayers with a, often King's David's, which is found in 1 Chronicles 29:11: "Yours, O LORD, is the power, the glory and the kingdom."
John Calvin wrote that the majestic ending should not be left out, because it " so well with the rest of the prayer."
