#### From the Pastor's Desk

Recently in the Bible Survey class I teach on Wednesday nights, we were looking at 1 Thessalonians 3. The Apostle Paul described his friend Timothy, a young pastor, as "God's fellow worker in spreading the gospel of Christ" (verse 2). We then talked about the ways that we, too, can work with God in spreading the good news of Jesus.



According to the latest Gallup report on church attendance, **only three in ten Americans attend religious services on a regular basis**, representing a sharp decline compared to the past twenty years. Of those who reported attending regularly, 21% said they attend on a weekly basis and 11% of respondents reported attending about once a month. 31% of Americans said that they never go to religious services.

A decade ago, Gallup found that 38% of Americans attended weekly or almost weekly. Two decades ago, 42% of Americans reported attending weekly or almost weekly. **Obviously, church attendance is headed in the wrong direction.** 

Breaking down the data of those who reported going to church, Gallup found that 44% of Protestants, 33% of Catholics and 26% of Orthodox Christians said they attended weekly or almost weekly.

Most Americans - our family members, friends, neighbors, and co-workers - are not going to church. God is calling us to work with Him in spreading the good news about His Son. We need to routinely and humbly tell others where our hope is found. We need to routinely invite people to come to church with us. Their lives and the future of our nation depend on it.

Remember that I love you, and please continue to be faithful in worship and in giving.

# Elders' Notes from March 21, 2024

- 1) A thank you note was received from Reid Roberson, the first recipient of HHPC's James Quillin Scholarship to Reformed Theological Seminary. He is the student pastor at Vernal Presbyterian Church in Lucedale, MS and will finish his course work at RTS in June. Reid will preach at Highland Heights on June 23, and there will be a potluck lunch in honor of him and his family.
- 2) Gratitude was expressed to: Ruling Elder Dennis Glaze and Barbara Glaze for making several repairs at the Church; Ruling Elder Kendra Bowers for installing 17 programmable thermostats; Deacon Rob McCleary, Jev Windham and Pastor Tim Foster for work on the Church grounds; and the Beacons' Sunday School Class for paying for the new shrubs at the driveway entrance.
- 3) **HHPC's newest missionaries Aaron & Katie** and their four sons moved to the Middle East on March 20. *Please pray for their safety and their ministry.*
- 4) \$29,082 has been given to the **New Organ Fund**. The goal is \$65,000. We are almost halfway there! *Please consider making an offering for Easter*.
- 5) "Call to Worship," a Gospel group of five local pastors and musicians, is going to have a concert at Highland Heights Wednesday night, April 10, from 6:30-7:30. One of their members, Luke McGarrh, was our choir director from 2002-2005.
- 6) **From Memphis to Kenya** \$30/month per HHPC family helps to feed the 80+ children in our adopted orphanage in Kenya. *Are you giving to this important ministry?*
- 7) **General Ministry Fund** income through February 29, 2024 was \$75,967 and expenses were \$85,992 for a deficit of \$10,025 (*due to several major, unexpected repairs*). The **General Ministry Fund balance** on February 29, 2024 was \$47,344.
